Because Sanborn used slightly different boundaries than City officials (and for other reasons), these numbers are approximate rather than exact. However, considered in order-of-magnitude terms and checked against other Sanborns and against bird's-eye aerial photographs, I think this is a basically accurate portrayal.

^{*}The "19th century" number of 140 and the "early 20th century" number of 134 are counts from the 465 properties enumerated with years of construction in the 1933 Davis property tax list. The "20s" figure results from subtracting 140 and 134 from 465. The total of 583 is my count of structures on the 1945 Sanborn map of Davis. That number subtracted from 465 results in 118 structures for the "classic" period.
